Ben Robins, from the NPR Audience Research and Insight department has sent the following great news:

"I'm pleased to report that the number of listeners to NPR member stations has reached a new record-high for the second consecutive Fall survey. The boost this time was driven in large part by the acquisition of two classical stations in the top markets - WQXR by WNYC New York and WCRB by WGBH Boston. To a lesser extent, improved audience ratings in some of the top PPM markets also helped boost total audience levels for NPR member stations.

The audience for NPR Programming did show an expected, but small decline, since the record-setting Fall 2008 'Election survey. Overall, these latest broadcast ratings for NPR and member stations compare favorably with much of traditional news media, as recently documented in the State of the News Media report".

Hearing about great things going up North is really inspiring and encouraging for our daily work at Public Radio 88FM in the Rio Grande Valley, the Southmost area of the country.
