The meaning of our service goes beyond the ratings

Following we want to share with our friends, donors, volunteers and public in general an excerpt from a recent message sent by Paula Kerger, PBS President, to PBS affiliate stations in the country, on relevant issues related to the unique way we serve our audience and the way our audience is measured.

One of the issues we are focused on is the fierce competition for the hearts and minds of our viewers. *CURRENT* (a publication both in print and online specialized on public broadcasting matters) touched upon this in an article in its July 6 edition that looked at the unique circumstances surrounding the Nielsen measurement at a handful of stations. While our challenges are real, I believe the article presented a distorted picture of what is actually happening with our audiences nationally. In fact, public television is not experiencing the rapidly diving audience estimates described in the article. Across television - both public and commercial - ratings are slowly, albeit consistently, declining. To date, PBS's national ratings are down 8 percent compared to last season but on par with or less than the decline at the major broadcast networks. For example, ABC's ratings are down 8 percent; NBC's, 11 percent; Fox's, 18 percent; and the CW's, 21 percent. The *CURRENT* article highlights issues PBS has been working on for several years, and will continue to address, including the deployment throughout our system of Nielsen encoders that provide stations with more accurate audience measurement. Thanks to support from CPB, PBS will begin subscribing to Nielsen's national ratings service in the fall, allowing us to coordinate more effectively data collection system-wide. Although we will never be a ratings-driven enterprise, reliable audience data is important, and I want to ensure we have an accurate view of what's happening and develop programming that best meets the needs of the public.

The quality of our work is our highest priority.

In a media environment that appears on a downward spiral to the very bottom, our focus on content that is relevant, essential, and distinctive will be critical if we are to continue to stand out amidst ever-increasing clutter. A recent case in point is the media feeding frenzy surrounding the tragedy of Michael Jackson's sudden death. While cable and networks rushed to wall-to-wall coverage, with «news» organizations such as TMZ providing source material to credible media organizations, we reported on the tragic event but devoted most of our coverage to the full range of important news stories of the day.

A small example, but a powerful reminder of the unique role we play in serving the public.

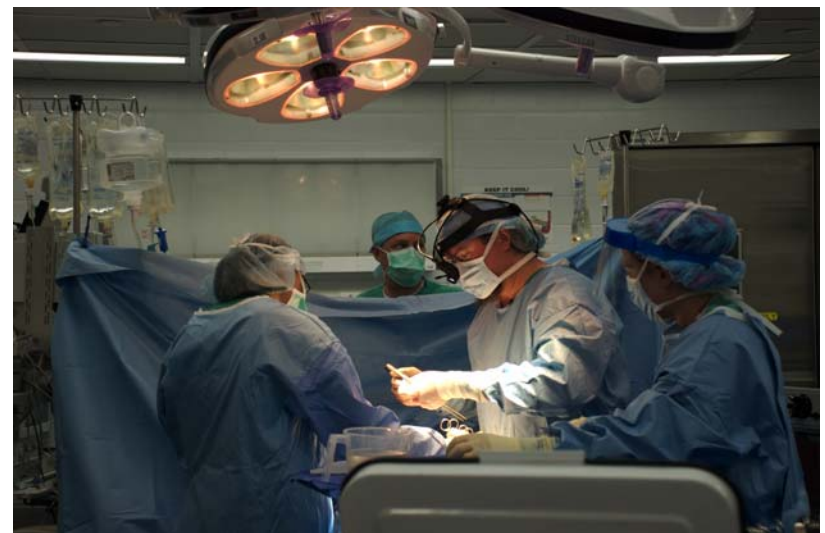

Ready To Learn

Starting School

from pbsparents.org



Every year kids start school—and every year parents wonder what to do. Whether it's your child's first day at preschool or the start of fifth grade, there are always new challenges. Kids, as well as parents, often struggle with saying *goodbye* at the classroom door and *hello* to the start of a new year.

Some kids will start the year off easily, breezing into the classroom with a quick goodbye — but after a few days (or even weeks) — cling as you try to leave. Others will enter the building only under protest from day one.

Then there are those who rush off to school with great enthusiasm but meltdown the instant you pick them up. Others may get stomachaches, or have difficulty falling asleep. Some may even experience going to school as a rejection, particularly if a younger sibling stays home with a parent or caregiver.

These are challenging but frequent reactions to the start of school. «All kids have a lot to adjust to when they are going to a new school or moving up to a new grade. And their reactions to starting school will vary. One of the big adjustments is separating from their parents and creating a bond with their new teacher,» says Linda Lendman, M.S.W, family coordinator at the Rand School in Montclair, NJ.

«Parents as well need to let go, learn to trust the teachers, and support their children's independent experience. And they need to recognize that their children may not approach school and learning the way they did,» says Michael Thompson, Ph.D. author of *The Pressured Child*.
