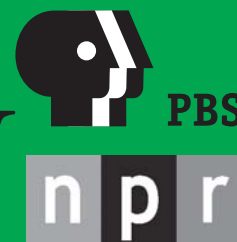

## Good bye, Channel 60, thank you for 25 years of service!

At midnight, between February 17 and 18 of 2009, the transmitter of Channel 60 was turned off for ever leaving our digital transmitter on Channel 38 with the responsibility of keeping up the educational service to the great community of the Rio Grande Valley.

KMBH observed all the digital transition process from the very origin as mandated by the Telecommunications Act of 1997. In October 2003 a brand new digital transmitter was installed and put at work over the air on Channel 38.

Since that time our digital transmitter has been broadcasting without interruption along with our analog transmitter, on Channel 60.

The original date for a digital transition was set by the Telecommunications Act for October 2006 (commercial stations) and October 2007 (non-commercial stations).

The US Congress voided this first attempt **alleging unpreparedness in the country for the digital TV transition**. A new date was set under the Digital Transition and Public Safety Act of 2005. This date being FEBRUARY 17, 2009. Only twelve days (!!!) before this date, the US Congress acted again to void its own rulemaking in order to permit TV stations to continue to broadcast analog signals up to June 12, 2009, once again **alleging unpreparedness in the country for the digital TV transition**. This time the deadline was not made mandatory, but it has been considered a concession to those broadcasters who want to exceed the originally mandated deadline of FEBRUARY 17, 2009.

KMBH, along with all other stations in the country, had been prepared for the transition on FEBRUARY 17, 2009. We have followed testing procedures, consumer education programs, paperwork trail, staff training.

In the meantime the already extended period of digital broadcasting, which began in October 2003 for KMBH, has made our finances bled abundantly.

Just in terms of electricity, an average of \$ 5,000.00 extra has been spent to keep our dual transmission up on the air, as mandated by federal rules. All together, throughout SIXTY FOUR MONTHS OF CONTINUOUS DIGITAL TRANSMISSION, represents now an expense of \$320,000.00 (THREE HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS, 00/100).

Additionally, through our own digital transition we have incurred in legal expenses (at a rate of \$50,000.00 a year), technical expenses (approximately \$25,000.00 a year), which makes an extra expense of \$375,000.00.

Our digital signal on Channel 38 had provided no significant service to our community through SIXTY FOUR MONTHS because our signal was also available through the analog signal of Channel 60.

February 17, 2009 had been promoted and planned for all TV stations in the country, KMBH included, as the date to shift our service from analog to only-digital, after an extremely long period of waste of money and resources, not to mention the aging of our digital facilities.

Our budget has shown the burden of this process during the last FIVE YEARS, with a mounting deficit mostly due to a digital system that we were forced to put on the air with no benefit at all.

Our budget FOR THIS FISCAL YEAR was prepared to begin to clean up our extra expenses on FEBRUARY 17, 2009 and to consolidate our audience in order to revamp our service to the community with the renewed support of our membership and our underwriting through our multi casting offer.

One more month of wasting money on a dual transmission would just cancel our aspirations to get our finances reorganized.

There is much confusion regarding the DTV Delay Act since no hard deadline was set by Congress, but a confusing period of four months through which TV stations can choose the date of their switching to digital-only transmission.

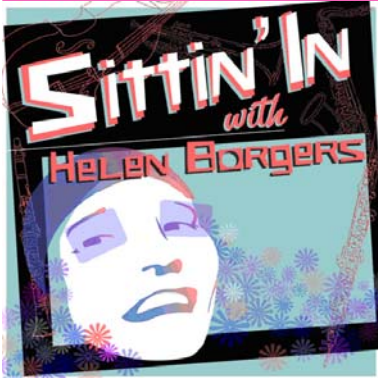
In the meantime the industry is sustaining big losses due to a vanishing audience. But the big loser is always the public, you and your family, if you depend on over the air television. Right now the country is divided between a first class of TV audience with access to digital TV and a second class which still depends on the limited service provided by a dying analog technology.

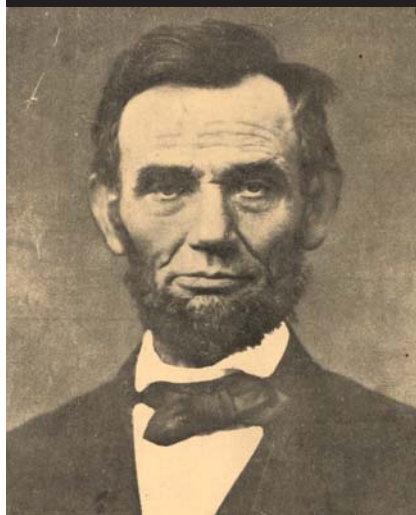

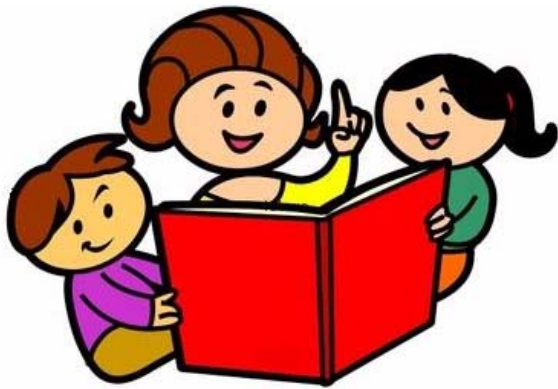

## Reading to Two: A Double Challenge

While parents understand the importance of reading to children, it is often a struggle to read to two. How can parents negotiate the «book wars,» when one child only wants to read chapter books and the other insists on reading picture books? What can parents do when one child wants to read about dinosaurs and the other wants to read about ballerinas?

While reading to two can be a challenge, there are strategies that do work. The strategies that follow can help you make the family reading experience meaningful, while helping your children to develop their abilities as readers and writers.

### Choosing the Right Books for Two

The first and most critical step is selecting the right books. Consider these tips as you try to find the right books for two.

#### **Choose topics that appeal to both your children.**

Look for interesting books that both children can «read,» such as, **Blue Hat, Green Hat** by Sandra Boynton or **Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed** by Eileen Christelow. Preschoolers can count and name colors, while toddlers will be enchanted by the colorful illustrations. Moreover, the catchy beat and refrain will help both your children become aware of the sounds of the language, while laying the foundation for reading and writing development.

#### **Consider the complexity of the story as well as the topic.**

If your older child thinks a book is too easy, he may lose interest. At the same time, your younger child can become frustrated with long, complex books. Try to select books that «stretch» your younger child, while appealing to your older child. You may even be surprised by how attentive your younger child can be.

#### **Choose books that have characteristics of good read-alouds.**

Good read-aloud books have action, strong characters, interesting dialogue, and a clear story line. Colorful illustrations can also help your children follow what's happening. Folktales and fairytales with colorful illustrations can enchant young and older children alike. Wordless books are also good choices because children of all ages can read the «story» in their own way.

#### **Read different kinds of books together.**

While your children may prefer certain kinds of books, try to expose them to different genres, or kinds of books, including poetry, non-fiction, and stories. Different kinds of books will help broaden their knowledge of the world and increase their vocabulary. Involve your children in taking turns choosing the books for the day.

#### **Establish a special time for family read-alouds every day.**

One of the most effective ways to encourage a lifelong love of reading is to make reading part of your family's regular routine. Reading daily will increase your children's vocabulary, their knowledge of the world, and their understanding of stories.

#### **Find time to read one-on-one with your children, too.**

Family read-alouds can help your children learn more about books, about sharing, and about each other. But children also need some alone time with you, when they can choose the books they like, ask as many questions as they like, and read aloud themselves.
