## Report on a KMBH's CPB audit

We have been informed that a final report on the audit practiced by the Inspector General Office of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) regarding the execution of grants awarded by the CPB during the fiscal years of 2007 and 2008 and the compliance of our stations with the CPB's eligibility criteria for station grant recipients is about to be made public through the web page of the CPB Inspector General, whose link appears on the home page of the CPB web site ([www.cpb.org](http://www.cpb.org))

KMBH received a notice from CPB officials regarding the CPB's intention to practice a "limited review" on KMBH financial execution of CPB grants and Public Inspection Files compliance as early as June 2008. A checklist of the documents to be reviewed was sent a month later from officials of the CPB's Inspector General.

We began to work on compiling the desired documentation immediately.

Hurricane Dolly, in July 2008, put the process of the CPB audit in a temporary stand by because an onsite visit from a CPB official was a part of the process. The visit was then re-scheduled by CPB for November 2008. Coming November, CPB re-scheduled again the date of the onsite visit for January 2009 due -we were told- to internal work load at the CPB Inspector General's headquarters.

In January 2009 an accountant from the CPB-IGO came to Harlingen and through one entire week he collected and inspected all the information and documentation he wanted.

At every moment KMBH has cooperated with this review.

After CPB's officials finished their investigation and exhausted their questioning on our accounting records and our public files a draft was sent to KMBH in August 2009 with the request for us to review the draft and prepare a response on the issues we considered in need of further explanation and consideration.

The final report is expected to include the CPB audit findings plus our response with clarifications.

A review of the CPB's Office of the Inspector General reveals that just everybody in the system is subject to scrutiny. The CPB-OIG constantly finds aspects and practices of the stations around the country to be corrected and clarified.

Our stations, KMBH-DT 38 (previously TV60) and Public Radio 88FM are not the exception. We really appreciate the CPB-OIG help in guiding us to finding specific practices in need of improvement and clarification.

We are certainly committed to continue to serving our Valley community as KMBH has done through the last twenty six years now.

Above all we appreciate the support and understanding of our viewers/listeners, donors, underwriters who are convinced of the valuable educational service of KMBH radio and TV for the past years and many years to come.

Once the report is released by CPB we will offer a link to it on our web site.

We also appreciate all questions our viewers/listeners, donors and underwriters might have regarding the upcoming CPB's audit report on KMBH.

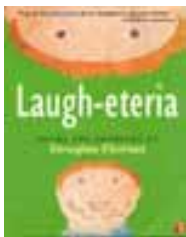
#### **Flicker Flash**
