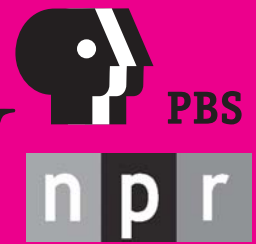

The day before... and after Dolly

The night before hurricane Dolly hit the Rio Grande Valley we at Channel 60-Digital TV 38 and Public Radio 88FM finalized our preparation to face the brutal force of winds and the destructive action of torrential waters. Our stations went off the air along with power outages which gradually affected most of the Rio Grande Valley on Wednesday, July 23.

An inspection was carried on at our studio building by the general manager and our engineers right the day after, on Thursday, July 24. Water leaks were found all over the place on our 25 year old building which under a most accurate inspection was determined to have suffered structural damages on water and wind.

The lack of electricity for several days and a very humid and hot weather produced excessive moisture in our TV master control area, which had just been recently refurbished in order to host our state of the art digital automation and video processing system.

Invisible condensation of humidity damaged all of our video servers, which needed to be replaced in order to be able to be back on the air. The assessment and ordering of the equipment took several days until the manufacturer shipped the replacement devices and a specialized engineer to configure the highly sophisticated devices.

Finally, one week after the hurricane we were able to be back on the air on Digital Channel 38 and on Cable-Channel 10, but our analog transmitter on Channel 60 revealed serious damages which were also related to the high humidity accumulated inside the transmission tubes. One of them, the one in charge of sending video over the air, was unable to do so due to a master magnet which resulted damaged beyond repair.

A new challenge was to find replacement parts for our analog transmitter, because all of the broadcasting industry in the US is in full gear engaged on the digital transition. When a replacement magnet was finally found we had been off the air on Channel 60 almost three weeks, while our digital channel 38 and our Cable Channel 10 were providing service to our viewers.

On the radio side we also faced great challenges above all due to the floods in the area of Lozano, where our transmitter for Cameron County is located. However, our service on Public Radio 88FM was fully restored right after electricity came back for all of our facilities involved.

We are still struggling with a cracked and leaking studio building, with discussions on insurance coverage, deductibles and interpretation of terms. Our staff has shown admirable commitment and dedication by working in the middle of leaks and poor conditions aggravated by the lack of Internet service for over two weeks (nowadays most of our business is conducted through Internet).

While facing our share of the hurricane damages we grow in solidarity with thousands of families who suffered damages in their homes and properties in the middle of floods, devastating winds and inclement weather. As we come gradually back to our full service of educational TV and cultural Radio we embrace our viewers, listeners, underwriters and friends with a BIG THANKS for your continued support!

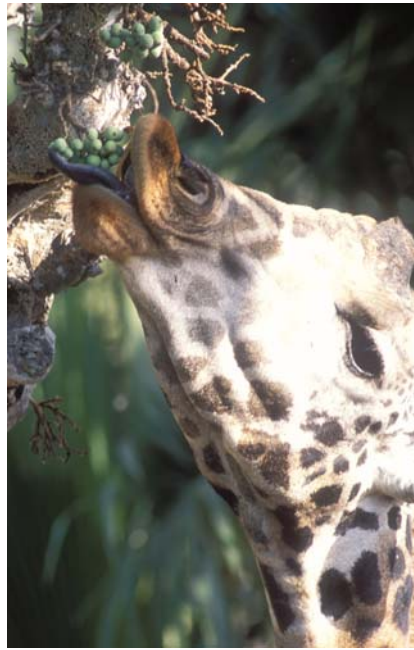

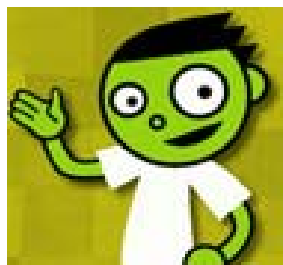

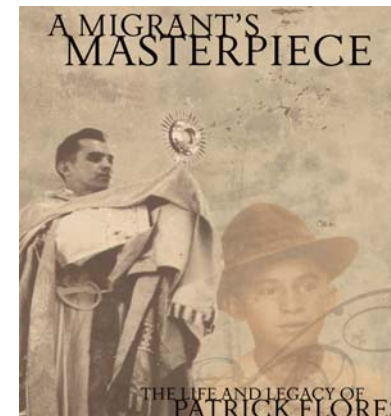
