From the very beginning of our TV multi casting service over the air (accessible to the public at no charge) to the Rio Grande Valley, in January 2008 we have presented, with much satisfaction and pride TWO OUTSTANDING EDUCATIONAL CHANNELS, ONE IN ENGLISH AND ONE IN SPANISH.

- 38.1 PBS
- 38.3 V-me

With the national process of transition to digital TV aimed at shutting down the old analog technology we went through a painful process of confusion and disappointment when our federal government (namely the US Congress) decided to arbitrarily change the already delayed deadline of February 17, 2009 to a never-clearly-explained date of June 12, 2009 for the execution of the transition.

For several months viewers and broadcasters all over the country (our Rio Grande Valley was no exception at all) did not know where the audience was, what the ratings were, who was watching what...

But KMBH, which had initiated its digital signal in October of 2003, kept its consistent educational service when a state of the art digital master control system was installed and commissioned by January 2008, more than ONE YEAR BEFORE THE FEDERALLY MANDATED DEADLINE OF FEBRUARY 17, 2009.

Our public in the Rio Grande Valley began to discover, as they adopted the digital TV technology at home, the beauty of this technology in sound and video and the richness of multi-channels such as 38.1 and 38.2, with PBS and V-me programming.

PBS is very well known by the public in the Rio Grande Valley because KMBH-Channel 60 began to carry it in 1983, only thirteen years after PBS was formed. Now, our channel 38.1 offers free access over the air to a 24/7 high quality educational programming, mostly in English. We expect to be able to move all of our non-English programming and most of our non-PBS content to any of our secondary channels, which offer by the way the same level of audio and video quality as our primary channel.

V-me instead, has been just lately discovered by most of our audience in the Rio Grande Valley and it continues to be discovered and very much appreciated through our Channel 38.2. One of the reasons of this sensation of newness is that V-me itself is fairly new. V-me was launched just in March 2007 under the auspices of Thirteen/WNET, the PBS affiliate station in New York.

V-me has become «the fastest-growing Hispanic network, (and) the 4th largest, according to Carmen DiRienzo, president and CEO, V-me. Only Univision, Telemundo and Telefutura (a sub-channel of Univision) hold rating positions above V-me, which has rapidly surpassed all of the cable TV outlets in Spanish language in the US and is coming after the big networks.

V-me entertains and informs Latino families in Spanish with primetime drama, music, sports, current affairs and Latin cinema, along with world class kids, food, lifestyle and nature. The 24-hour digital network, partnered with public television stations, is currently available in 70% of all Hispanic homes - rising to 80% by year end. V-me is the first venture of the media production and distribution company, V-me Media Inc.

Back to school snacks

Now that the kids are back in school it's more important than ever to make sure they eat healthy. Eating nutritious snacks will help ensure they get their daily allowances of fruits and vegetables. Snacking healthy will help boost their immune system, alertness, and keep them at a healthy weight. PBS Parents has the following suggestions that will help you and your child stay on track.



Stay on Track with Healthy Snacks (from pbsparents.org)

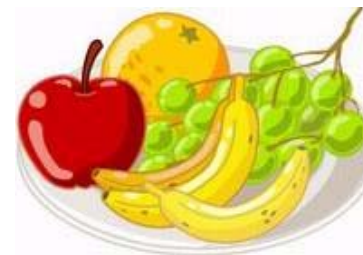
«I want a snack!» Most parents know that phrase all too well. We may occasionally roll our eyes upon hearing it, but it is OK for kids to eat a little something between meals. In fact, snacks can play a big part in fulfilling a child's daily nutritional requirements.

The important thing is to provide children with nutritious snacks that don't undermine our primary goal of keeping them healthy and fit. Avoid foods that are fried, processed, too oily or too salty. And, definitely keep sugar to a minimum. If your child eats healthy snacks from the start, they'll likely continue to make good food choices throughout their lives.

As for serving sizes, young children don't need large portions. Many experts agree that servings should equal about one tablespoon of food for each year of a child's age. Enjoy serving them those small portions now, because your grocery bills will increase dramatically as they get older!

Healthy Snack Ideas:

- Crunchy vegetable sticks (carrots, celery) with low-fat ranch dip (for older preschoolers)
- Nearly frozen applesauce
- Melon Melody: Watermelon, cantaloupe and honeydew with non-fat whipped cream
- Ants on a Log: Peanut butter on celery with raisins
- Mud & Dirt: Low-fat pudding with crushed graham crackers mixed in
- Peanut butter on half of a whole-wheat bagel
- Whole-wheat crackers or whole-wheat tortilla with salsa
- Hummus and pita wedges
- «Light» microwave popcorn with grated parmesan cheese (for children three years and older)
- Mini-pizzas: Half an English muffin covered with a tablespoon of tomato sauce, then topped with part-skim mozzarella cheese



Note: Avoid feeding foods such as hot dogs, sausages, hard pieces of raw vegetables, popcorn, nuts, seeds, dried fruits (including raisins), whole grapes and round candies to children under the age of three, due to choking hazards. If you're unsure about what's right for your child, please contact your pediatrician.
